

President - Sean Vanlandingam, MD, MBA, FACEP

Sean Vanlandingam, MD, MBA, FACEP has been an emergency medicine physician in Alabama for the last 10 years. Currently he practices at the University of Alabama at Birmingham and several other hospitals throughout the state. Previously he has served as Emergency Department Medical Director and Chief Medical Officer in the Ascension St. Vincent's health system. He did his undergraduate studies at Southern Methodist University, completed his MBA at the Stanford Graduate School of Business, and medical school at UAB. As a resident at UAB he became involved in ALACEP and later in 2017 he became a board member. Most recently he has served as the Treasurer and is looking forward to serving now as President. President Elect - Jaron Raper, MD

Jaron D. Raper, MD, is an emergency medicine physician and assistant professor at the UAB Heersink School of Medicine.

He completed his training at Carolinas Medical Center in Charlotte, NC, where he served as chief resident in his final year. He now serves as assistant program director of the UAB Emergency Medicine Residency program, and has been core faculty at UAB since 2018.

Dr. Raper's academic interests include innovative simulation practices and the acute diagnosis and management of patients suffering from pulmonary embolism, with a focus on appropriate triage and disposition.

In addition to his responsibilities at UAB, Dr. Raper also serves as an executive board member for the Alabama Chapter – American College of Emergency Physicians. Dr. Raper was recently designated by national ACEP as a "Young Physician Leader" in the state, and in 2022 he was honored by the Council of Residency Directors in EM as "Best Speaker" at their national conference in San Diego, Calif.



Therese Medalle, MD

Therese Medalle, MD is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Emergency Medicine at University of Alabama at Birmingham Heersink School of Medicine. She completed medical school at the University of Florida College of Medicine and Emergency Medicine residency training at the University of Alabama at Birmingham.

Her commitment to teaching has earned her several awards and recognitions for excellence in education. Dr. McDonald is an active member of the American College of Emergency Physicians and has held various roles in hospital and non-academic appointments, including positions at Medical West, UAB Critical Care Transplant, Grandview Medical Center, and more. Their research experience spans studies on aspirin use and cancer, women's health, and prostate cancer.

Dr. McDonald's dedication to healthcare extends beyond clinical practice, demonstrated through involvement in medical missions, AIDS education, and serving as a mentor in the Big Brother/Big Sister program. They have received numerous accolades, including the UAB Hospitality Hospital Administration Award, and have completed specialized training in healthcare leadership and emergency response.
